Areas commonly scrutinized include:

- Background screening and hiring standards
- Driver qualification file documentation
- Motor vehicle record (MVR) monitoring
- Driver training and corrective action history
- Compliance with FMCSA safety requirements

Even small documentation gaps can be presented as evidence of systemic safety failures.

Continuous MVR Monitoring

Annual MVR reviews often miss mid-year violations or license suspensions. Continuous monitoring alerts fleets to emerging driver risk in real time, enabling immediate response.
